

## FormLet for FireFox Browser. 10/30/17

FormLet appears to be the only reliable form saver add-on and only for FireFox. AutoFormer+ that worked in both Chrome and Firefox, has been discovered not to separate Outbound and Inbound HTML, of the same form name, do not use. In Firefox add this add-on called FormLet:



Then in options, make ALL checkboxes and fields look like below:

Save empty fields

If this field is checked, then Formlet saves also empty fields. This means that while restoring form - fields saved as empty will be cleared.

Save hidden fields

If this field is checked, then Formlet saves also hidden fields.

Save password fields

Check this field to store passwords. CAUTION: it's not recommended to store password using this extension. Formlet does not encrypt stored data, which can be easily read by unwanted person.

Save form ID

By default Formlet saves form ID or path and allows to restore data only in form with exactly the same ID or path. When this option is unchecked, Formlet saves form without ID and allows to run bookmarklet on any active (focused) form (but form fields names still have to match).

Show options in context menu

If this field is checked, Formlet will be displayed in context menu as a group and you will be able to change some Formlet options in context menu.

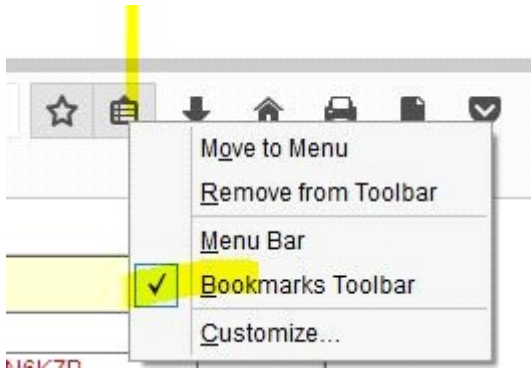
Pattern for bookmarks title

Set your own bookmarks title pattern. You may use following symbols, which will be dynamically replaced: {TITLE} - will be replaced by page title; {DATE} - will be replaced by current date.

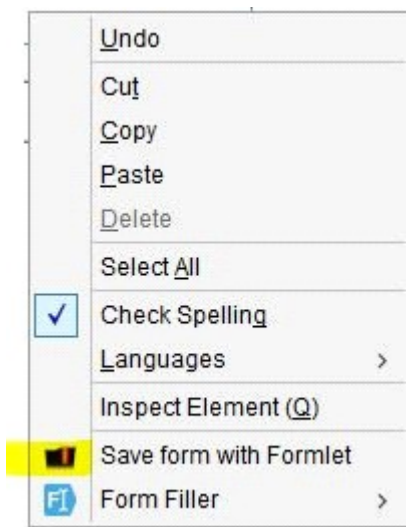
Bookmarks folder

Now set Firefox up so you can use the toolbar at the top to see saved forms:

Click the notepad looking icon, then select BOOKMARKS TOOLBAR



To save a form, right click ON any template field and click Save form with Formlet:



The saved form name and date, (more info if you hover with mouse), will be on the top bar. Each time you save the same form, it will increment the form name, with the new date and time, (latest same form will always be on the far right):



You can save many forms, and when you open the same blank form back up, just click on any blank form field, then click the saved form name/date/time from top bar you wish to restore. The saved forms are history bookmarks that can also be seen via the "History" Icon.

You can delete previous saved forms if you wish to reduce the clutter.

Suggest learning how this the add-on works, use it a few times. I have tested this on Windows 7 and 10, 32/64 bit. It also remembers what you have saved even if you close Express or shut the computer down.
